Artist	Year	Inspiration
1. Franny Swann	1864	A painting of an 1864 Victorian half penny.
2. Roxanne Jackson	1932	Amelia Earhart became the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean in 1932.
3. Reem Acason	1938	On 30th September 1938 Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain signed the Anglo-German Declaration with Chancellor Adolf Hitler in an attempt to prevent war in Europe.
4. Ruth Geldard	1940	The silk featured in this painting was obtained by Ruth's mother, Jessie Martin, nee Chapman, who in the year this paper was made, was serving in the W.A.F.
5. Sonia Boué	1940	Sonia's family evaded a Nazi roundup of Spanish republican exiles at Anguoulême on August 20th 1940, to the Mauthausen Camp.
6. Marilyn Kyle	1947	1947 was the year of the Partition of India: the two self-governing countries of India and Pakistan legally came into existence at midnight on 14/15 August 1947.
7. Ann Bridges	1950	Andy Pandy appeared on TV in 1950, on For the Children (later Watch with Mother).
8. Carol Balthazar	1950	Inspired by the launch of TV Tupi in São Paulo (Brazil) on September 18, 1950.
9. Graeme Campbell	1951	The Festival of Britain exhibition brochure from 1951 - the original 'tonic for the nation'.
10. Joanne B Kaar	1954	In 1954, North of Scotland Hydro-Electric, Board and the Scottish Peat Committee, ordered a peat-powered gas turbine engine to generate electricity from peat in Caithness.
11. Iona McCuaig	1955	Ruth Ellis was hung in Holloway Prison, 13th July 1955 for shooting her lover, David Blakely, in broad daylight outside a London pub, she was the last women to be hung in Britain.
12. Laura Fisher	1955	On 26 September 1955 Clarence Birdseye's most famous invention, the fish finger went on sale in the UK.
13. Dawn Cole	1956	On 1st January 1956 it was made illegal to be in possession of heroin in the UK.
14. Jemma Gunning	1957	1957 is the year that the now derelict Cwm Coke Works in South Wales started to produce coke.
15. Dave Edwards	1960	First seen by the public in a televised demonstration in late 1959, the world's first automatic, plain-paper copier did not become commercially available until the following year, 1960.
16. Letitia Tunstall	1961	The building of the Berlin Wall began in 1961.
17. Dan Thompson	1961	The Soviet pilot, Yuri Gagarin became the first human to journey into outer space, orbiting the Earth in Vostok 1 in 1961.
18. Clive Holland	1962	Clive was only seven in 1962 and his response to Paper Trail is in the form of an audio track of him reading the story behind a piece of paper from his childhood.
19. Mark Lomax	1964	In 1964 the Civil Rights Act was passed in America. This Legislation was intended to end discrimination based on race, colour, religion, or ethnic origin.
20. Anne Amosford	1965	On 9th November 1965 a Private Member's Bill to suspend the death penalty for murder was introduced.
21. Jennifer Merrell	1967	Summer of love when 10,000, mostly young, people gathered in the Haight-Ashbury district of San Francisco to cast off the conservative morals of the time and experiment with drugs.
22. Paul Hazelton	1969	One of Paul's earliest memories was hearing the moon landing on the radio.
23. Jocelyn Leigh	1969	A tribute to Margaret Hamilton the programmer for the Apollo 11 mission which put a man on the moon.
24. Sharon Hall Shipp	1971	In 1971, the world's first women's refuge was opened in Chiswick.
25. Cherrie Trelogan	1977	A zine sharing memories of Cherrie's emerging adulthood in 1977.
26. Clare Dales	1982	In 1982, the Commodore 64 Computer became the highest-selling single computer model of all time.
27. Helen Stone	1982	The first known computer virus called Elk Cloner programmed by 15-year-old Rich Skrenta as a prank in February 1982, and spread via a game shared on a floppy disk.
28. Timothy Tolio	1986	The Chernobyl disaster was a nuclear accident that occurred on Saturday 26 April 1986.
29. Neil Armstrong	1991	The dissolution of the USSR, resulting in fifteen independent republics, took place in 1991.
30. Julia Rogers	1994	1994 was the year Julia met her husband; the year of making this piece represents 25 years of them knowing each other.
31. Lorna Dallas-Conte	2000	Charts the progress of Lorna and her husband and their connections with water.
32. Kate Murdoch	2001	The year of the 9/11 Terrorist attacks in the USA and a year of personal loss for Kate.
33. Tracey Bush	2002	Inspired by a copy of an opera score for Il Trovatore by Verdi and an opera library ticket both dating to 2002.
34. Julie Kirk	2010	The tale of the quiet skies over Europe in April 2010 when ash from Eyjafjallajökull, the Icelandic volcano, caused planes to be grounded and people to stay where they were.
